- This was the final year of our FAST Institute Project with Milwaukee Public Schools, funded by Carnegie Corporation of NY (more detail included in the report)
- A new partnership was initiated with the **Early Learning Coalition of Miami/Dade County** to begin FAST Institute with early childhood educators in Miami
- Collaboration with the **Wisconsin Evaluation Collaborative (WEC) at UW-Madison** to help make our surveys easier to use, more efficient, and ensure cultural relevance.
- Over the last year, we have worked with partners in Wisconsin, Illinois, Nebraska, Oklahoma, Texas, Mississippi, Alabama, Florida, Georgia, South and North Carolina, Virginia, Pennsylvania, Ohio, New York, and Vermont through our FAST Program and FAST Institute to unite families, schools, and communities



The FAST Institute of Family Engagement continues to grow across the country in new schools and districts. As we wrapped up our two-year pilot project with Milwaukee Public Schools, funded by Carnegie Corporation of New York, we received funding to expand into the early childhood space, with projects in Miami/Dade County and locally in Wisconsin, as well new partnerships in K12. We look forward to continued opportunity to work with more educators and schools through the FAST Institute.

At the end of the year, 100% of participating educators agreed or strongly agreed that due to their participation in the project:

- "My knowledge about family engagement strategies has increased"
- "I feel more connected to parent coordinators at other schools"
- "I feel more confident in my abilities to engage families at my school," and
- "I have built my skills in working productively with staff/colleagues."

All but one agreed or strongly agreed that due to their participation in the program:

- "My school has a more family-friendly environment."
- "I feel more connected to my school staff."
- "My school has achieved stronger family engagement goals."
- "My principal sees family engagement as more of a priority at my school."
- "My principal has become more supportive of my family engagement efforts"
- "I have built my skills in recruiting, attracting, and retaining families
